THE PROBLEM

In theory, the fundamental promise of our democracy rests upon the trust that the government fulfills the will of the people.

In practice, there is a growing list of issues – like campaign finance reform, gun violence prevention, access to healthcare, and voting rights – where the federal government has consistently failed to deliver the people's will.

The judicial system, the Electoral College, and the United States Senate and the House of Representatives are each, in their own way, institutions dedicated to upholding the power of the minority of Americans.

THE SOLUTION

Rep. Casten's legislation – two bills and a constitutional amendment – would:

- Establish 12 at-large senators to be elected through a national popular vote. This also creates 12 national votes in the Electoral College.
- Add approximately 250 additional Members of the House, if it had been implemented after the 2020 census.
- Rebalance the power of the Supreme Court by creating a 13-judge multicircuit panel to hear cases where the United States or a federal agency is a party.
